






There is just something about fall, and hurricanes, that can really make you think. The weather changes, and a new wind can "blow in" new things. Throughout the summer we strived to get our new Systems/ASM 1.70 out the door. The greatest features being its ability to help transition any ASM program from a traditional mainframe environment to the new mainframe Linux environments.

In concert with Systems/ASM 1.70 we have just released the 1.70 Release of Systems/C and Systems/C++. The new Systems/C and Systems/C++ PLINK utility has been totally rewritten, to meet the demand of more modern Systems/C and Systems/C++ programs. In particular, this version of PLINK supports "weak" definitions, allowing for automatic instantiation of C++ templates without the need for cumbersome build machinations or bloated load modules. This new version of PLINK can also function as a replacement for the IBM pre-linker. IBM compatible objects, generated by Systems/C and Systems/C++, can now be pre-linked on cross-platform hosts, greatly improving the build management process. Systems/C runtime also now includes new ASCII/EBCDIC translation routines which aid in interoperability with ASCII systems. Systems/C has been enhanced to provide language features compatible with SAS/C(tm), easing the transition from a SAS/C programming environment to a new Systems/C programming environment.

So - let the winds of change blow, and bring in new features that help everyone!
